Accord (noun) - Agreement - *On 31 May the two leaders signed a peace accord.*

Evident (adjective) - clearly understood or seen - *Her love for him was evident **in** all that she did.*

Intend (verb) - **to have as a plan or purpose** - *The course is intended for intermediate-level students.*

Utter(verb) - **to say something or to make a sound with your voice** - *She sat through the whole meeting without uttering a word*

Scarce(adjective) - **not easy to find or get** - *Food and clean water were becoming scarce.*

Commit(verb) - **to do something illegal or something that is considered wrong** - *He was sent to prison for a crime that he didn't commit.*

Approach(verb) - move towards, come close to - *We could just see the train approaching in the distance.*

Policy (noun) - a plan of action adopted by an individual or social group - *They believe that Europe needs a common foreign and security policy.*

Vain (adjective)- **unsuccessful** - *The doctors gave him more powerful drugs in the vain hope that he might recover*
